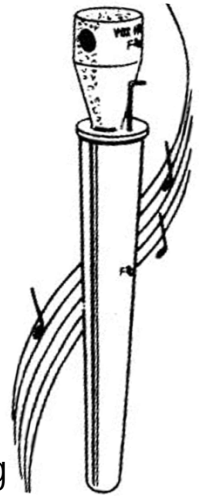

Ron has performed for us at this organ to resounding reviews and will join us again at **2pm, Sunday May 27th. (Doors 1:30pm)**

At this event, elections will be held for several positions on the CATOE board. These include President, Secretary, Vox Editor and a 'Member at Large'. Please attend if you want to vote. Only individuals with paid 2007 CATOE Memberships can vote! Voting will be done **BEFORE** the 2pm social, with results announced during a brief business meeting, **AFTER** the social. #### Directions...

##### From the SOUTH:

To reach the seminary from Interstate 94, take the Hwy 176 exit and turn right at the foot of the ramp to head west (the ramp loops around). Go approximately 4 miles. You will see signs for the University on your right.

##### From the NORTH:

From Interstate 94, take the Hwy 137 exit and turn right. Go approximately 5 miles and turn left onto route 45 (Lake Street). Approximately 2 miles, at University Drive, the entrance is on the left.

**Note:** The seminary has one entrance on Route 45 (Lake Street) and another on Highway 176 (Maple Avenue). Upon entering the campus follow University Drive to the left. The auditorium is on the north side of the campus on Principal Avenue. (North of the offices and library.)

#### About the May Artist

Ron Reseigh has an established record on the national theatre organ circuit, but is most familiar as a staff organist at the 'Organ Piper' restaurant in suburban Milwaukee for the past 6 years. In 1998 Ron won the ATOS "Young Organist of the Year" award, and can be found performing at organ conventions and concerts in England, Canada, and across the United States.

Ron is working on his first album, scheduled to be recorded on the Organ Piper's 30 rank Wurlitzer organ later this year. Ron and his wife Sarah, spend most of their free time raising their two young daughters.

🕒 April saw the use of the Monsignor Charles Menter Memorial Wurlitzer Theatre Organ, in the George Cardinal Mundelein Auditorium for the Albert Cardinal Meyer Lecture Series, given by the Archbishop of the Anglican Church, Nicholas Tom (N.T.) Wright. The Mundelein organ was played by Mr. David Rhodes before two of the lecture sessions.

In attendance were students from many different universities and colleges, including students from the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago; Wheaton College; Christ Church College of Madison, Wisconsin; Trinity College in Deerfield, as well as students from the Milwaukee area, and the University of Chicago. Over 750 people participated in this lecture series.
